AAA Scholarships:

Continued Achievement Scholarship

- **Amount:** \$2,000
- **Description:** The American Academy of Audiology Foundation's Continued Achievement Scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded to two students who show exceptional promise as a clinical audiologist as evidenced by the student's resume, letters of recommendation, and personal statement. The Continued Achievement Scholarship Program is generously sponsored by [AudiologyOnline](#).
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The Continued Achievement Scholarship will be awarded only to fulltime graduate students in audiology (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) in good standing at a U.S. university during the 2023–2024 academic year.
- **Timeline:** The 2024 application will be available in January.

Empowering Students Scholarship

- **Amount:** \$5,000
- **Description:** The American Academy of Audiology Foundation's Empowering Students Scholarship of \$5,000 will be awarded to six students who show exceptional promise as a clinical audiologist as evidenced by the student's resume, letters of recommendation, and personal statement. This scholarship program is generously funded by Oticon Hearing Foundation. \$30,000 in scholarship funds are available, and Oticon is designating up to \$20,000 of these funds for Black students.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The Empowering Students Scholarships will be awarded only to fulltime graduate students in audiology (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) in good standing at a U.S. university during the 2023–2024 academic year.
- **Timeline:** The 2024 application will be available in January. The notification date is August 15.

Jerry Northern Scholarships in Pediatric Audiology

- **Amount:** \$10,000
- **Description:** The AAA Foundation is excited to announce a scholarship opportunity for students interested in pediatric audiology. Dr. Jerry Northern has graciously donated to

the Foundation to award three students with \$10,000 each in scholarship funds and \$500 each for travel expenses to AAA 2024+HearTECH Expo in Atlanta, GA.

- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The Jerry Northern Scholarship in Pediatric Audiology will be awarded to full-time graduate students enrolled in an audiology (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) program and in good standing at a U.S. university during the 2023-2024 academic year. Applicants must be in at least their second academic year in the graduate program and have completed at least one course in pediatric audiology.
- **Timeline:** The 2024 application will be available in January. The notification date is August 15.

Judith Blumsack Scholarship

- **Amount: \$500**
- **Description:** On the occasion of her retirement from Auburn University in 2014, students, colleagues, friends, and family joined together with the AAA Foundation to honor Judith Blumsack, PhD, with a named scholarship. In addition to her long career as an audiology professor, mentor, and clinician, Dr. Blumsack is a former member of the Foundation Board of Trustees, making her scholarship an especially fitting tribute to an individual that has inspired and touched many over her 30-plus-year career.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The American Academy of Audiology Foundation's Judith Blumsack Scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to one student who demonstrates outstanding clinical skills and who shows promise in terms of clinical research and service to the professional community and/or the community at large. The Scholarship will be awarded only to a fulltime graduate student in audiology (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) in good standing at a U.S. university during the 2023–2024 academic year. Students must be in at least the second year of their program when the scholarship is awarded and cannot graduate in Spring/Summer 2023.
- **Timeline:** The 2024 application will be available in January.

Sadanand Singh Memorial Scholarship

- **Amount: \$500**
- **Description:** A respected university educator, scientist, publisher, and philanthropist, the audiology profession lost a great friend in 2010 with the passing of Dr. Sadanand Singh. Donations from Dr. Singh's friends, family, and colleagues have enabled the establishment of a scholarship celebrating his dedication to research and the next generation of hearing scientists.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The American Academy of Audiology Foundation's Sadanand Singh Memorial Scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to one minority and/or

international student who shows exceptional promise in audiology research as evidenced by his/her resume, letter of recommendation, and personal statement. The Sadanand Singh Memorial Scholarship will be awarded only to a fulltime graduate student in audiology (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) in good standing at a U.S. university during the 2023–2024 academic year.

- **Timeline:** The 2024 application will be available in January.

Student Travel Award Reimbursement (STAR) Program

- **Amount:** Up to \$500
- **Description:** The American Academy of Audiology Foundation's STAR Program offers full-time audiology graduate students (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) at a U.S. university funding to support their participation in professional meetings where they will present research or gain an educational experience not available in their academic programs. Selected students will receive reimbursement to participate in any qualifying educational event, including AAA 2023+HearTECH Expo. For a virtual event, the registration fee will be reimbursed.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** Students must be **full-time audiology graduate students** (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) at a U.S. university at the time of the conference. Students **presenting their own research** are given preference in STAR Program funding. Students can **only receive one STAR Program award** during their graduate school career. Awarded **funding constitutes a reimbursement for allowable expenses** incurred and will be made following conference attendance and the submittal of appropriate documentation. Students are **required to notify the Foundation if they have applied for and/or have received funding from other sources**. STAR funding is not intended for use when other mechanisms of support have already been provided/received to cover conference expenses.
- **Timeline:** The notification date is January 16.

Student Travel Award Reimbursement (STAR) Program – Washington State

- **Amount:** Up to \$1,000
- **Description:** Through a generous donation from the Washington Society of Audiology (WSA), the American Academy of Audiology Foundation is offering full-time audiology graduate students (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) from a Washington state-based university funding to support their participation in professional meetings in the hearing sciences or other subjects related to the students' professional coursework. The selected students will present research or gain an educational experience not available in their academic

programs. The selected students will receive reimbursement to participate in any qualifying educational event, including AAA 2023+HearTECH Expo. For a virtual event, the registration fee will be reimbursed.

- **Eligibility/Requirements:** Students must be **full-time audiology graduate students** (AuD, PhD, AuD/PhD) at a U.S. university at the time of the conference. Students **presenting their own research** are given preference in STAR Program funding. Students can **only receive one STAR Program award** during their graduate school career. Awarded **funding constitutes a reimbursement for allowable expenses** incurred and will be made following conference attendance and the submittal of appropriate documentation. Students are **required to notify the Foundation if they have applied for and/or have received funding from other sources**. STAR funding is not intended for use when other mechanisms of support have already been provided/received to cover conference expenses.
- **Timeline:** The notification date is January 16.

National Scholarships:

Graduate Student Scholarship (ASHFoundation)

- **Amount:** \$5,000
- **Description:** Students (who are undergraduate seniors accepted to a master's program or students currently pursuing master's or doctoral (research or clinical) degrees).
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The applicant must be accepted for, or enrolled in, graduate study in a communication sciences and disorders program in the United States. Clinical doctoral programs in audiology or master's programs in speech-language pathology must be accredited by, or in candidacy status from, the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology; this does not apply to research doctoral programs. The applicant must be enrolled in full-time study for the full academic year
- **Timeline:** Applications open in 2024, due May 18.

American Association of University Women (AAUW) International Fellowships

- **Amount:** \$20,000
- **Description:** The program provides support for women pursuing full-time graduate or postdoctoral study in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or

permanent residents, and who intend to return to their home country to pursue a professional career.

- **Eligibility/Requirements:** International Fellowships are open to women, including people who identify as women, in all fields of study at an accredited institution of higher education or, for postdoctoral fellows, research. AAUW will make final decisions about what constitutes eligible institutions. Must have citizenship in a country other than the U.S. or possession of a nonimmigrant visa if residing in the U.S. Women who are currently, or expect to be during the fellowship year, a U.S. citizen, U.S. permanent resident, or dual citizen with the U.S. and another country are not eligible. Must hold an academic degree (earned in the U.S. or abroad) equivalent to a U.S. bachelor's degree completed by the application deadline. They must intend to devote themselves full-time to the proposed academic plan during the fellowship year. Must intend to return to their home country to pursue a professional career upon completion of their studies.
- **Timeline:** Application opens August 1 and deadline for submission ends November 15.

AMBUCS Scholarship Program

- **Amount:** \$600-\$1,500
- **Description:** Since 1955, National AMBUCS, Inc. has awarded scholarships to students pursuing degrees in **physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology and hearing audiology**. To date, more than \$9.8 million in scholarships have been awarded to over 16,500 students.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** Students must be US citizens accepted in a graduate-level program that is accredited by the appropriate therapy profession authority in physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology, or hearing audiology. Assistant or undergraduate programs are not eligible. Awards are based on financial need, commitment to local community, character for compassion and integrity, and career objectives.
- **Timeline:** National AMBUCS, Inc. accepts applications for its scholarship program from **February 1 at 5:00 pm ET** until **May 1 at 11:59 pm ET**, annually.

AAHD Frederick J. Krause Scholarship on Health and Disability

- **Amount:** \$1,000
- **Description:** The mission of the American Association on Health and Disability (AAHD) is to contribute to national, state, and local efforts to promote health and wellness in people with disabilities and identify effective intervention strategies that reduce health disparities between people with disabilities and the general population. AAHD accomplishes its mission through research, education and advocacy at the national,

state and community level. As part of our work, we are pleased to offer an annual scholarship to students with disabilities majoring in public health, disability studies, health promotion or a field related to disability and health.

- **Eligibility/Requirements:** Applicant must be enrolled as a **full-time** undergraduate student and must have completed one full year of college or more. In other words, the applicant must have **sophomore or greater** status in a program at a college or university pursuing an undergraduate degree as of fall 2023; or enrolled **part-time** or **full-time** in a graduate school, pursuing a post graduate degree as of fall 2023. **Important:** applicants who have not yet graduated from high school will **not** be considered. High school students entering college, for the first time, in the fall of 2023 are **NOT** eligible to apply. The only exception would be for high school students who have achieved sophomore status via high school AP course credits. Applicant must have a disability as defined by [the American with Disabilities Act](#) and must provide documentation to verify this. Preference will be given to students majoring in public health, disability studies, health promotion or a field related to disability and health. Preference will be given to students with a history of community service and/or volunteer activities. Applicant must be a US citizen or legal resident living in the United States and enrolled in an accredited United States university. Those who serve on the *Disability and Health Journal* Editorial Board are **not** eligible for the AAHD Scholarship.
- **Timeline:** Deadline is March 2024

IHS Scholarships

- **Amount:** Unspecified
- **Description:** The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to educate and train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. We strive to develop our next generation of leaders, as well as help make the pursuit of a meaningful career in Indian health attainable for American Indian and Alaska Native students.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** reparatory and Pre-Graduate Scholarships: Recipients must be a member or descendant of a federally recognized, state-recognized or terminated American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native village. Health Professions Scholarship: Recipients must be a member of a federally recognized American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native village only.
- **Timeline:** Deadline is February 2024.

EAA Doctoral Scholarship

- **Amount:** Up to \$2,000

- **Description:** The Doctoral Scholarship sponsored by the Educational Audiology Association is awarded on an annual basis. Up to \$2,000 of financial assistance will be presented to a student or students enrolled in good standing in a Doctoral of Audiology (AuD) or Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) program at an accredited university. The applicant must show a vested interest in educational and/or pediatric audiology either through research, volunteerism, or clinical experience. The scholarship is not based on financial need.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** The applicant must be a student member of the Educational Audiology Association. The application must provide proof of enrollment in an accredited AuD or PhD program. Please include a letter from the program director that verifies the applicant's good standing within the program. The applicant must be enrolled in the 2nd, 3rd or 4th year within the academic program. Transcripts verifying a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- **Timeline:** Deadline is May 1st.

Sallie Mae Scholarship

- **Amount: \$2,000**
- **Eligibility/Requirements: The \$2,000 Sallie Mae Scholarship Sweepstakes** (the "Sweepstakes") begins at 12:00:01 AM Eastern Time ("ET") Sunday, January 01, 2023 and ends at 11:59:59 PM ET on Sunday, December 31, 2023 (the "Sweepstakes Period"). Sponsor's computer is the official clock for this Sweepstakes. The \$2,000 Sallie Mae Scholarship Sweepstakes is only open to legal residents of the 50 United States, the District of Columbia and any US Territory age 17 or older at the time of entry, and who meet one (1) of the four (4) following eligibility requirements at the time of entry:
 - a parent who currently has a child enrolled in an accredited college or university located within the United States;
 - a student who is currently enrolled in an accredited college or university located within the United States;

- **Amount: \$25,000**

- **Eligibility:** The \$25,000 “Be Bold” Scholarship is a [no-essay scholarship](#) that will be awarded to the applicant with the **boldest** profile. To us, boldest does not mean “best”, or “most accomplished”. Being bold means being:
 - Earnest
 - Determined
 - Moving

The scholarship will be awarded to the student whose profile is most bold, according to these characteristics. Furthermore, this scholarship will be similar to the many [easy scholarships](#) available on Bold.org in that it will favor students who apply earlier—who are bold and seize the day without procrastinating. Students at any [education level](#), [state](#), [field of study](#), and [GPA](#) will be considered.

The Legacy Lab Scholarship

- **Amount:** \$15,000
- **Description:** The scholarship will go to a student who represents the next generation of legacy makers. With growing interest in the scholarship, this year’s recipient will receive \$15,000 to put toward school-related expenses. The scholarship will continue to honor Black and African American students to help achieve their long-term ambitions as future leaders and entrepreneurs. Applications open near the end of September.
- **Eligibility/Requirements:** To qualify, you must be a Black or African American student with a strong sense of personal purpose—who is studying with the intent of creating positive, enduring change. Specifically, we are asking applicants to reveal something meaningful about their *ikigai* (“reason for being”) by responding to questions.
- **Timeline:** Applications open September 18 and are due by October 23.
