### Graduate Student Scholarship (ASHFoundation)

- o Amount: \$5,000
- Description: Students (who are undergraduate seniors accepted to a master's program or students currently pursuing master's or doctoral (research or clinical) degrees).
- Eligibility/Requirements: The applicant must be accepted for, or enrolled in, graduate study in a communication sciences and disorders program in the United States. Clinical doctoral programs in audiology or master's programs in speech-language pathology must be accredited by, or in candidacy status from, the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology; this does not apply to research doctoral programs. The applicant must be enrolled in full-time study for the full academic year

  communication sciences and disorders (CSD). Former and current members of ASHA's
  Board of Ethics review the essays and select three winning authors.
- Eligibility/Requirements: Students: To be considered eligible to participate in the SEEA competition, you must be... enrolled in any undergraduate, post baccalaureate, or entry-level graduate program (U.S. only) in CSD, and enrolled part-time or full-time during the 2022–2023 academic year.

# American Association of University Women (AAUW) International Fellowships

o Amount: \$20,000

 Description: The program provides support for women pursuing full-time graduate or postdoctoral study in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or

- permanent residents, and who intend to return to their home country to pursue a professional career.
- eligibility/Requirements: International Fellowships are open to women, including people who identify as women, in all fields of study at an accredited institution of higher education or, for postdoctoral fellows, research. AAUW will make final decisions about what constitutes eligible institutions. Must have citizenship in a country other than the U.S. or possession of a nonimmigrant visa if residing in the U.S. Women who are currently, or expect to be during the fellowship year, a U.S. citizen, U.S. permanent resident, or dual citizen with the U.S. and another country are not eligible. Must hold an academic degree (earned in the U.S. or abroad) equivalent to a U.S. bachelor's degree completed by the application deadline. They must intend to devote themselves full-time to the proposed academic plan during the fellowship year. Must intend to return to their home country to pursue a professional career upon completion of their studies.
- o Timeline: Application opens August 1 and deadline for submission ends November 15.

# AAHD Frederick J. Krause Scholarship on Health and Disability

Amount: \$1,000

O Description: The mission of the American Association on Health and Disability (AAHD) is to contribute to national, state, and local efforts to promote health and wellness in people with disabilities and identify effective intervention strategies that reduce health disparities between people with disabilities and the general population. AAHD accomplishes its mission through research, education and advocacy at the national, state and community level. As part of our work, we are pleased to offer an annual scholarship to students with disabilities majoring in public health, disability studies, health promotion or a field related to disability and health.

- Eligibility/Requirements: Applicant must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student and must have completed one full year of college or more. In other words, the applicant must have sophomore or greater status in a program at a college or university pursuing an undergraduate degree as of fall 2023; or enrolled part-time or full-time in a graduate school, pursuing a post graduate degree as of fall 2023. Important: applicants who have not yet graduated from high school will not be considered. High school students entering college, for the first time, in the fall of 2023 are **NOT** eligible to apply. The only exception would be for high school students who have achieved sophomore status via high school AP course credits. Applicant must have a disability as defined by the American with Disabilities Act and must provide documentation to verify this. Preference will be given to students majoring in public health, disability studies, health promotion or a field related to disability and health. Preference will be given to students with a history of community service and/or volunteer activities. Applicant must be a US citizen or legal resident living in the United States and enrolled in an accredited United States university. Those who serve on the Disability and Health Journal Editorial Board are **not** eligible for the AAHD Scholarship.
- Timeline: Deadline is March 2024
