AAHD Frederick J. Krause Scholarship on Health and Disability

- o Amount: \$1,000
- Description: The mission of the American Association on Health and Disability (AAHD) is to contribute to national, state, and local efforts to promote health and wellness in people with disabilities and identify effective intervention strategies that reduce health disparities between people with disabilities and the general population. AAHD accomplishes its mission through research, education and advocacy at the national, state and community level. As part of our work, we are pleased to offer an annual scholarship to students with disabilities majoring in public health, disability studies, health promotion or a field related to disability and health.
- Eligibility/Requirements: Applicant must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student and must have completed one full year of college or more. In other words, the applicant must have sophomore or greater status in a program at a college or university pursuing an undergraduate degree as of fall 2023; or enrolled part-time or full-time in a graduate school, pursuing a post graduate degree as of fall 2023. Important: applicants who have not yet graduated from high school will not be considered. High school students entering college, for the first time, in the fall of 2023 are NOT eligible to apply. The only exception would be for high school students who have achieved sophomore status via high school AP course credits. Applicant must have a disability as defined by the American with Disabilities Act and must provide documentation to verify this. Preference will be given to students majoring in public health, disability studies, health

promotion or a field related to disability and health. Preference will be given to students with a history of community service and/or volunteer activities. Applicant must be a US citizen or legal resident living in the United States and enrolled in an accredited United States university. Those who serve on the *Disability and Health Journal* Editorial Board are **not** eligible for the AAHD Scholarship.

Timeline: Deadline is March 2024

IHS Scholarships

o Amount: Unspecified

- Description: The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to educate and train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. We strive to develop our next generation of leaders, as well as help make the pursuit of a meaningful career in Indian health attainable for American Indian and Alaska Native students.
- Eligibility/Requirements: Preparatory and Pre-Graduate Scholarships: Recipients must be a member or descendant of a federally recognized, state-recognized or terminated American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native village. Health Professions Scholarship: Recipients must be a member of a federally recognized American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native village only.
- o Timeline: Deadline is February 2024.

Sallie Mae Scholarship

Amount: \$2,000

- Eligibility/Requirements: The \$2,000 Sallie Mae Scholarship Sweepstakes (the "Sweepstakes") begins at 12:00:01 AM Eastern Time ("ET") Sunday, January 01, 2023 and ends at 11:59:59 PM ET on Sunday, December 31, 2023 (the "Sweepstakes Period"). Sponsor's computer is the official clock for this Sweepstakes. The \$2,000 Sallie Mae Scholarship Sweepstakes is only open to legal residents of the 50 United States, the District of Columbia and any US Territory age 17 or older at the time of entry, and who meet one (1) of the four (4) following eligibility requirements at the time of entry:
 - a parent who currently has a child enrolled in an accredited college or university located within the United States;
 - a student who is currently enrolled in an accredited college or university located within the United States;
 - a parent who currently has a child enrolled as a high school senior located within the United States;

- a student who is currently enrolled as a high school junior or senior who intends to enroll in an accredited college or university located with the United States, within a year of graduating high school ("Entrant").

o Amount: \$25,000

- Eligibility: The \$25,000 "Be Bold" Scholarship is a <u>no-essay scholarship</u> that will be awarded to the applicant with the *boldest* profile. To us, boldest does not mean "best", or "most accomplished". Being bold means being:
 - Earnest
 - Determined
 - Moving

The scholarship will be awarded to the student whose profile is most bold, according to these characteristics. Furthermore, this scholarship will be similar to the many <u>easy scholarships</u> available on Bold.org in that it will favor students who apply earlier—who are bold and seize the day without procrastinating. Students at any <u>education level</u>, <u>state</u>, <u>field of study</u>, and <u>GPA</u> will be considered.

Amount: \$15,000

 meaningful about their ikigai ("reason for being") by responding to questions.
- o **Timeline:** Applications open September 18 and are due by October 23.
